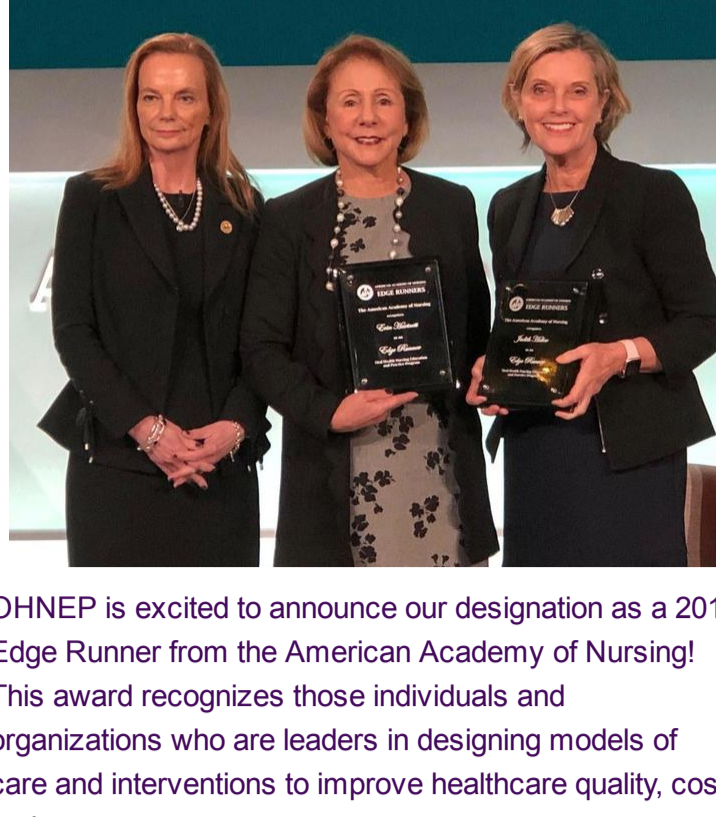


Spotlight: OHNEP Receives 2019 AAN Edge Runner Award!

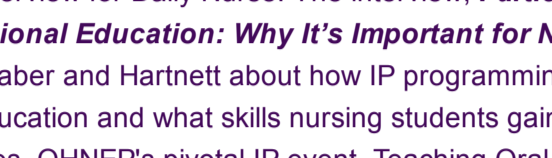

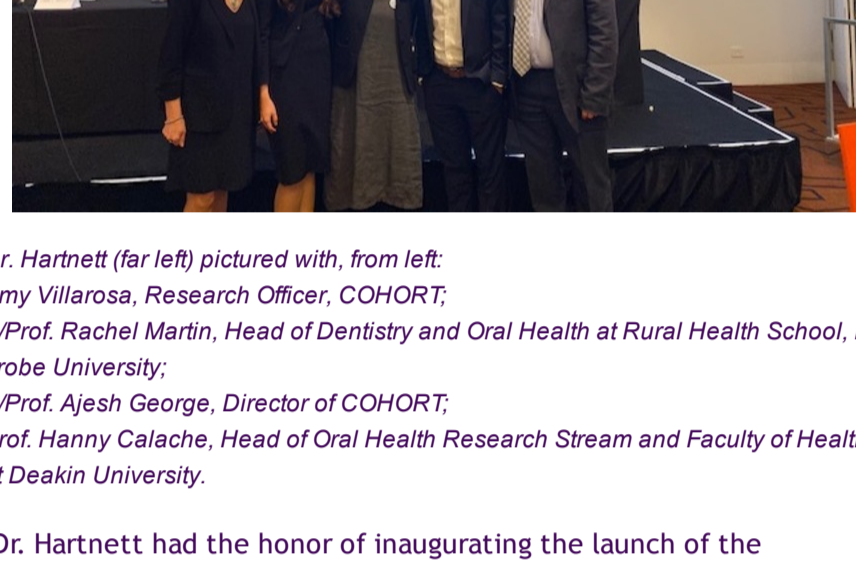

Launch of the Australian Network for Integration of Oral Health

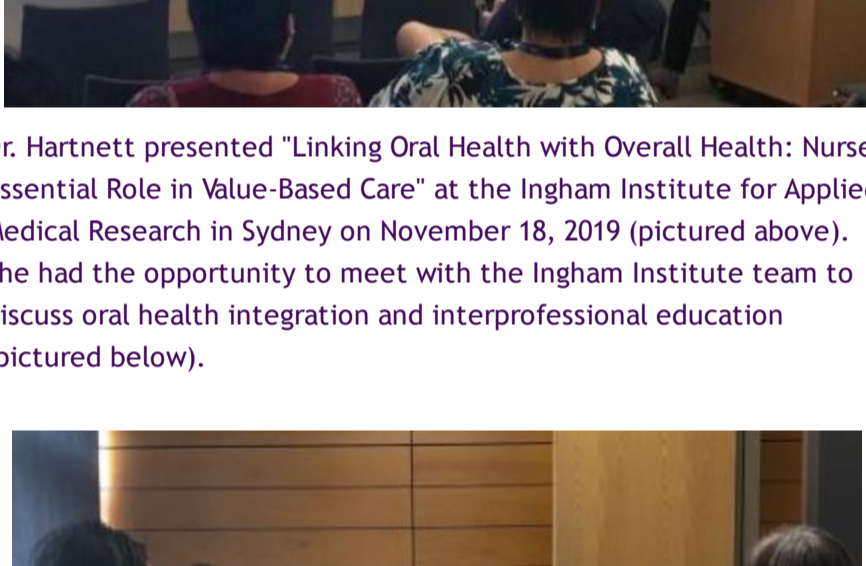

Dr. Hartnett had the honor of inaugurating the launch of the Australian Network for the Integration of Oral Health (NIOH) at the 2nd Asia Pacific Conference on Integrated Care in Melbourne, Australia on November 12, 2019. She was invited to present by the Centre for Oral Health Outcomes and Research Translation (COHORT) at Western Sydney University in Australia, where she has been appointed as an honorary Adjunct Associate Professor.

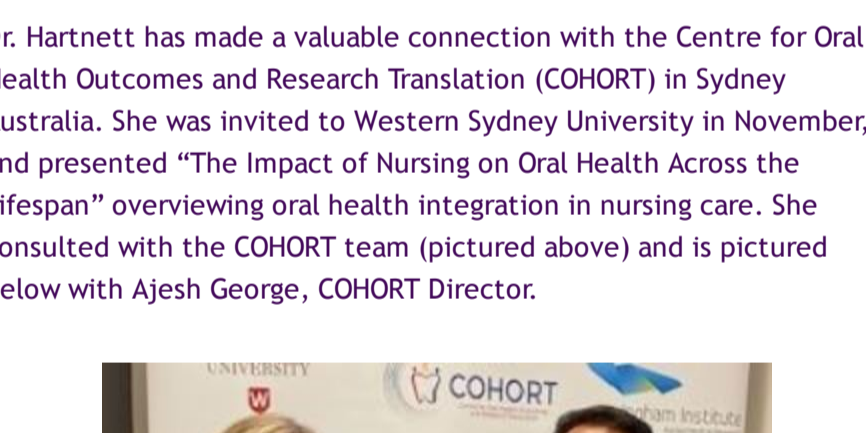
Ingham Institute for Applied Medical Research

Centre for Oral Health Outcomes and Research Translation



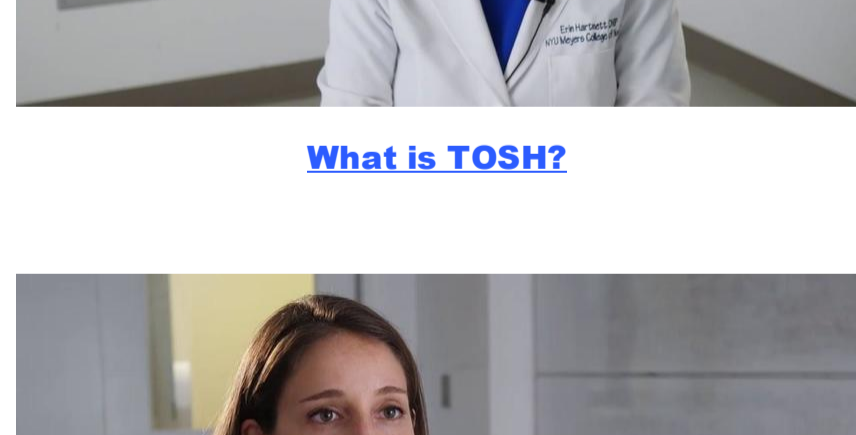
